
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

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
# RESTROOM ACCESSIBILITY

Scope: Modernize the restrooms on the sanctuary level by making them more accessible and people of all abilities can feel more welcome.

Cost: \$80,000

# **OUTDOOR LANDSCAPING**

Scope: Replace the stairs and landscaping outside the main entrance to create a more welcoming and safer entryway. Add railing for accessible entry. Fix drainage issues.

Cost: \$40,000







### **Brighton Campus-Sanctuary**

# HVAC

Scope: Replace the existing heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) system in the sanctuary. The system is nearly 30 years old and the current refrigerant can no longer be sourced.

Cost: \$250,000

# AIR CONDITIONING

Scope: Make the sanctuary more welcoming and comfortable during the warmer months of May through September by installing mini-split system.

Cost: \$20,000 (Funded)








# PARKING LOT REPAVING

Scope: Repave the Brighton Campus parking lot to create a safer, more hospitable surface for all who use it.

Cost: \$200,000

# CARPET AND PAINT

Scope: Replace old carpeting in the parsonage and standardize the color of paint on the first floor.

Cost: \$8,000

# TRASH ENCLOSURE

Scope: Enclose the trash and recycling area in the corner of the parking lot so that the outdoor spaces on campus look more welcoming, orderly and clean.

Cost: \$11,200







# **PAINTING**

Scope: Paint several areas within the main building and repair holes, marks and damaged walls. The main areas of focus include the sanctuary, community room, fellowship hall, the front stairway and hallways. This will help keep the building looking fresh and welcoming.

Cost: \$28,100







#### **Parsonage**

# **DRIVEWAY**

Scope: Replace damaged and dangerous asphalt driveway at the parsonage. This project improves safety for the pastors, their family and the neighborhood kids who ride their bikes up and down the driveway.

Cost: \$18,000

# **ROOF**

Scope: Replace aging roof on The Well Student Ministry Center. Remove shingles and decking as needed. Seal leaking skylight.

Cost: \$16,000





#### **Additional Projects, Brighton Campus**

### **Coffee Station**

Replace old serving station cabinetry and fixture in fellowship hall to create a more functional, modern, and welcoming space. Cost: \$15,000 (completed)

### **Playground**

Scope: Install an elementary-age accessible playground at the church to encourage fellowship amongst families. Cost: \$150,000

### **Lighting & Sound**

Replace existing lighting in the sanctuary with LED bulbs to improve lighting coverage, reduce maintenance requirements and to become more energy efficient. Add hearing assistance machine allowing people to use their own hearing aids to enhance sound. Cost: \$75,000

### **Masonry Repair**

Seal mortar between the bricks on education wing to prevent moisture build up. This prevents damage and maintains a nice appearance. Cost: \$3,350

### **Preschool Entryway**

Replace the faded awning at the preschool entrance to create a more friendly and welcoming environment. Cost: \$3,400

#### Roof

Replace aging sanctuary roof to fix missing roofing tiles. Cost: \$30,000 (completed)

### **Elevator**

Modernize the elevator to include systems required for modern code. Cost: \$20,000

### **Carpet**

Replace the carpet in the hallway and Congregational Care/Mission & Justice Engagement Offices. Cost: \$5,000 (completed)



#### Additional Projects, Brighton Campus continued

# **Window Replacement**

Replace 26 aging windows with new energy-efficient vinyl windows to improve utility costs. Cost: \$50,000

## **Deck Railing, The Well**

Extend railing from the deck on The Well to ensure the safety of students and adults. Cost: \$1,000

## **Solar Panels, if funds allow**

Installing solar panels to improve energy efficiency and environmental stewardship.

#### Additional Projects, Whitmore Lake Campus

# Fellowship Hall Flooring / Kitchen Upgrade

Replace existing flooring in the fellowship hall that is stained and worn out to create a more welcoming space. Replace aging kitchen appliances like stove and diswasher to assist in providing hospitality. Cost: \$15,000

### **Classroom Renovations**

Redesign and update the Mary Martha Room to make it a welcoming and comfortable classroom for small groups and meetings. Cost: \$10,000
